



## Allen Wayne Rehberg

March 23, 1942 - January 23, 2026

Allen Wayne Rehberg entered into his final rest on January 23rd 2026, to await the return of his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He was born in Cairo, GA on March 23, 1942 while his parents lived in Thomasville, GA. He is survived by his loving wife of 61 years, Diana Lois (Agner) Rehberg of Madison, FL; their Daughter, Cassandra (“Sandy”) Mae and Charles Busch of Liberty, SC; their son, Allen Russell (“Tater”) and Celeste Rehberg of Orlando, FL; five grandchildren, Parker (Kaytlyn) Busch of North Charleston, SC; Madison (Drew) Vislocky of Greenville, SC; A. J. Rehberg of Orlando, FL; Nicholas Rehberg of Orlando, FL; and Carolina and CJ Eldridge of Travels Rest, SC. He is further survived by 3 great granddaughters, Elloree, Arwyn and Illiana Busch of North Charleston, SC; and many nieces and nephews ... he loved them all dearly!

He was preceded in death by his beloved parents, Irving Russell and Lillie Mae (Turner)

were married in Media, PA on May 2, 1964. Wayne entered the US Army in January 1964, taking his basic training at Ft Jackson, SC and his AIT at Ft Holabird, Baltimore, MD. He became a Special Agent in Military Intelligence and served 4 years and a month in the Army, including a year in Vietnam. Following his military service, Wayne was employed with the federal government primarily in Human Resources, and retired on January 2, 2001. He worked for the Veterans Administration, Civil Service Commission, Department of Energy, Office of Special Council, NASA, US Army, and Department of Defense.

Wayne and Diana made Madison County their full time residence in August 2021. He was of the Baptist faith, but had become substantially convicted of Seventh Day Adventist Doctrines. He enjoyed reading and studying his Bible, particularly about biblical prophecies. He was part of the Cherry Lake American Legion Post; and a past member of The Sons of Confederate Veterans. He enjoyed College Football and was an avid fan of the Georgia Bulldogs ... but nothing compared to his love for his Lord and family.

Funeral services will take place Friday, January 30, 2026 at 11:00am, at Madison Seventh Day Adventist Church. Burial will follow at Pine Grove Baptist Cemetery.
