On June 12, 2021, Carolyn Lee (“Carol”) Musser Waldrep passed away peacefully at Rose Tara Senior Living in King, North Carolina. She was 83 years old.

Carol Waldrep was born on November 5, 1937, in Cleveland, Ohio to Edward D. Musser and Hazel M. (Dorian) Musser. Her family moved to Madison, Florida, in 1951.

Carol graduated from Madison County High School in 1955.

After Bill retired from Eli Lilly, he and Carol moved to Destin, Florida in 1991. They enjoyed golf, a good drink, and dining with family and friends. In 2018, Bill and Carol moved back to Madison, where Bill passed away in 2019.
