On January 24, 2020, Frank Hurst, 83, passed from this life into the loving hands of his Lord and Savior.

He proudly served in the United States Marine Corps for twenty-seven years, which included time in Korea during 1954-55 and two tours in Vietnam from 1966-67 and 1969-70. Frank was a world traveler- visiting the Holy Land twice and taking trips to Turkey, Egypt, and most recently Nova Scotia.

He was a member of Disabled Veterans of America, the American Legion Post 0107 of Live Oak, and Hopewell Baptist Church where he was a Deacon since 2014. Frank showed his love through acts of service- having helped his community and family throughout his life. He will remain in our hearts a loyal and steadfast friend, father, and grandfather.
