



## Mr. Roy Franklin Milliron Jr.

June 22, 1941 - August 3, 2024

Roy Franklin Milliron, Jr., a beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend, passed away peacefully on August 3, 2024, at the age of 83. He was born on June 22, 1941, in Tallahassee, FL, to Roy Franklin Milliron, Sr. and Myrtle Bevis Milliron but spent his life in Madison, FL.

Roy was a member of First Baptist Church of Madison and was a proud graduate of Madison High School, and North Florida Junior College. He also attended Florida State University, and participated in the FSU Flying High Circus. After a period of serving as the Recreation Director and then the Assistant City Manager in New Port Richey, he moved back to his hometown of Madison, where he ran a successful real estate business for 30 years. He was dedicated to the community and served as a School Board member, two times as Rotary Club President, Economic Development Director, and twice as President of Madison County Chamber Of Commerce. He was instrumental in leading the Rail to Trails bike/walking path in Madison County, obtained the signage and dedication for the 100 mile bike loop throughout the county bringing cycling tourism to the county, and successfully led the fight to preserve Madison's beautiful natural resources by defeating the location of a hazardous waste incinerator within the County.

Roy's life was characterized by his unwavering love for his family, his devotion to friends, and his passion for adventure. An avid outdoorsman, he enjoyed

hunting, fishing, hang gliding, running, cycling, skiing, and playing hearts at the campsite. He also loved to travel, taking multiple cross-country trips on a motorcycle. His hobby was woodworking where he created beautiful pieces of art that will be cherished by family and friends for generations to come.

He is survived by his loving wife of 61 years, Suzanne Milliron, his three children and two daughter-in-laws, Scott (Patty) Milliron of Sanford, FL, Paige Kelly of Madison, FL, and Victor (Shehla) Milliron of Tallahassee, FL, his 5 grandchildren, Liz, Tyler, Matt, Mary, and Kylie, as well as 6 great grandchildren, Jace, Bo, Coltin, Kayden, Karson, and Hudson. Roy was preceded in death by his parents and his sister, Laura Coleman.

Roy will be remembered for his example of hard work, quiet strength, honesty, and his dedication and love to family, friends, and community, along with bringing a laugh to those around him. His legacy lives on through the love and memories he leaves with his family and friends.
